Practice Notes...

Criminal procedure - protective order - State witness' identity: Reversing the Court of Special Appeals (CSA) in *Lancaster v. State*, 180 Md. App. 1 (2008), the Court of Appeals (CA) here holds that trial judge erred by permitting State to keep witness identity secret until trial date where specifics as to allegedly threatened witness' expected testimony, alleged threats against the witness were not revealed in motion hearing, and alleged "reputation for violence" of defendants associates. Permission for counsel to obtain information but not to disclose the information to defendant did not cure prejudice because defendant knew hidden witnesses and would have been able to help with trial preparation. New trial was required. *Lancaster v. State*, - Md. - (8/27/09). Submitted by Katrina Wallace, Esq.

Criminal procedure - public vs. closed hearings - mandatory weighing: This case reviews four factors court must weigh before possibly granting constitutionally permissible closure of public trial: 1)

a "party seeking to close the hearing must advance an overriding interest that is likely to be prejudiced"; (2) "the closure must be no broader than necessary to protect that interest"; (3) "the trial court must consider reasonable alternatives to closing the proceeding"; and (4) the trial court "must make findings adequate to support the closure." In the present case, trial judge heard specific testimony that some of defendant's family tried to intimidate witnesses and properly ordered them to stay outside of courtroom during trial. *Robinson v. State*, - Md. - (7/28/09).

Civil procedure - peace orders & injunctions - 1st Amendment: Prior issuance of a peace order did not bar Plaintiff from also seeking injunctive relief (exceeding statutory terms of peace order) for same conduct. Injunction did not violate 1st Amendment free speech rights by prohibiting "fighting words," obscenities and verbal harrassment between neighbors. *Davidson v. Seneca Crossing Homeowners Assoc.*, - Md. App. - (8/31/09).

Civil procedure - discovery - anonymous internet defamation: Where Plaintiff claims online defamatory statement by an unknown person, Plaintiff may obtain a court order for disclosure of the unknown person's identity from the service provider IF certain conditions are satisfied. Holding outlines factors to be considered a showing of need, sufficient allegation of defamation, necessity for disclosure, etc. *Independent Newspapers v. Brodie*, 407 Md. 415 (2009).

Economic slump evident across the county

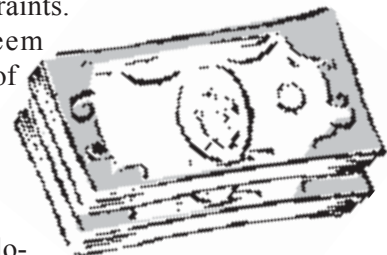
The effects of the downturn in the economy are being felt throughout Anne Arundel County. In the legal industry, the list of the affected can go on and on. Lay offs of attorneys and support staff, delayed start dates for recent law school graduates hired at larger firms, hiring freezes for the government. Doing more with less is the motto all around – diminished support staff working for more attorneys, decreases in resources such as library subscriptions or new office equipment, or cutting back on the use of outside sources for repairs or copying. Fancy lunches at exclusive clubs used to be the norm, but fewer partners have memberships and there's a lot less lunching at those places anymore. Some of the perks that many firms used to offer are certainly being taken away. Stockpiles of food and beverages for employees are no longer a given, and salaries have been frozen -- bonuses slashed.

New law school graduates and law clerks are surely affected by the scarcity of firms advertising to hire right now. This, in turn, has led to some going out on their own, or taking temporary, part time, or non-lawyer jobs. Clients are also hurting and looking for cost-cutting by negotiating fees more often or looking to smaller firms for lower rates. Reportedly, the economic times have led to an increase in pro bono work. There are also changes in the type of attorney demanded – those in the area of bankruptcies and foreclosures have seen an upturn in business these days. The economy could lead to slightly decreased participation in bar associations and events that cost money, and has for some smaller, specialty bars.

While the budget is tight at the courthouse, as well as in the county and state as a whole, a new courtroom is still set for construction. Funding for a 12th judge was approved by the Legislature this year, and though that position has yet to be advertised, there is no indication that the economy is the cause. Although the new courtroom will be smaller than some of the others, the modest size was slated even before the economic downturn. The costs will be kept down with no extra bells and whistles, and this time county employees will be doing the job, unlike in the past when it was done by outside contractors.

As we all have heard, the number of foreclosure filings has increased. In general, civil case filings have gone up year to year in the county as the population grows, but nothing has risen as drastically as foreclosures in the last few years. The numbers are just starting to level off. Last month's *Barrister* listed the cutbacks and changes that have been made to several family law programs due to budget restraints. The economy does not seem to have affected the number of case filings, though. Although national reports indicate that at least a small percentage of people are delaying divorces due to finances, locally the number of divorce and other family law filings do not appear to have markedly changed since 2006. Similarly, it has been said that the number of pro se litigants

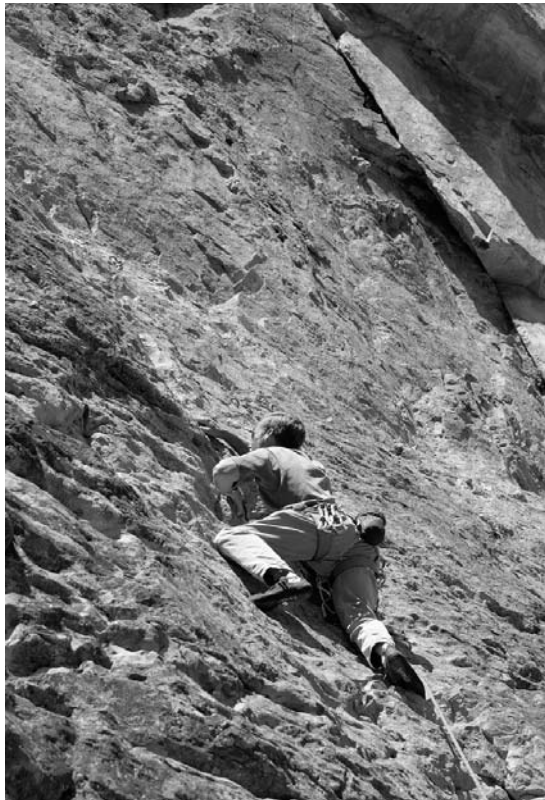

Schools in the court

Program gives county students a close up view of the justice system

Almost 100 county teens will crowd the courtroom of the Anne Arundel County District Court in Annapolis on Thursday, Nov. 12. They will appear before Judge Danielle M. Mosley – not with their attorneys, but with their teachers – and they will learn, first-hand, about the consequences of making bad decisions.


This up-close view of the state's justice system in action is part of the biannual Schools in the Court program, which will be held on Nov. 12, 9-11:30, at the Anne Arundel County District Court, 251 Rowe Boulevard, Annapolis. Students from Annapolis, South River and Southern high schools will sit in on actual criminal cases in the courtroom of Judge Mosley, who leads the program.

"This is a normal day in court, and the students will see defendants who are many times not much older than themselves," Judge Mosley said. "We want the students to learn how the court system

works but, perhaps more importantly, we want them to understand how making wrong choices about things such as speeding, driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol, drug use, and other crimes can deeply and adversely impact their lives."

In addition to watching actual criminal cases, the students will hear from victims and people who have been convicted of drinking and driving. They will learn about the legal and financial consequences of being charged with drunk driving, and meet with a representative from Maryland's Shock Trauma Center.

The Anne Arundel County District Court holds Schools in the Court twice each year. The program was started in 2001 by Anne Arundel County District Judge Vincent Mulieri, who retired after hosting 10 sessions of the unique program.

The Anne Arundel County Public Schools (AACPS) Board of Education will tape the program to air on AACPS's cable television channel. Broadcast times will be posted at www.aacps.org.

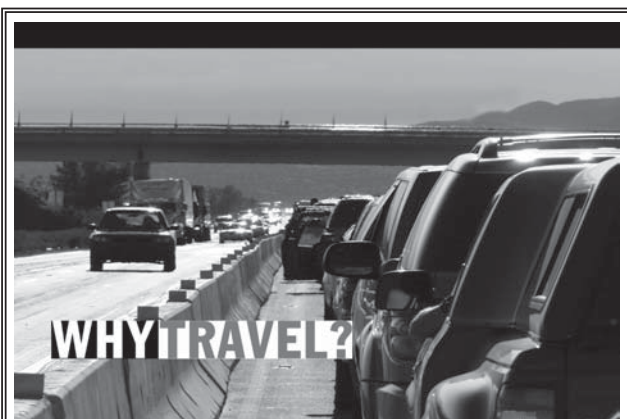

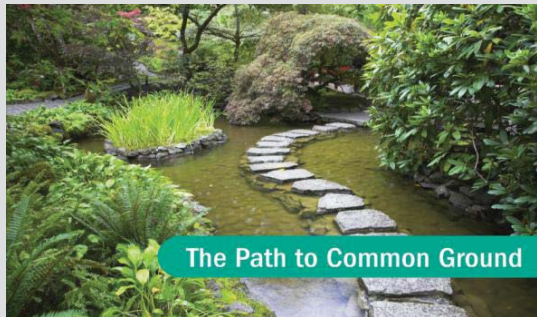
