District Court back to full strength

Over the last year the grumbling in the halls of our district courts were growing louder as attorneys complained of clogged dockets and visiting judges no one recognized. "I had to plea a jury trial," one lawyer recounted in a DWI case when a visiting judge walked into the courtroom that he did not know.

Gov. O'Malley finally changed all that last month when he announced his selection of the three new district court judges: (1) **Eileen A. Reilly**, Office of the State's Attorney; (2) **Shaem C. Spencer**, City Attorney, and (3) **H. Richard Duden, III**, Hyatt & Weber. These new judges fill the void left in the court from last summer when **Judge Vincent Mulieri** and **Judge James Dryden** both retired after 17 years on the bench, and **Judge J. Michael Wachs** was elevated to circuit court in January of this year. These three well qualified lawyers were chosen from more than 25 applicants who applied and several attorneys who had previously been recommended by the Judicial Nominating Commission.

Through a process that caused a few members of the Commission to resign over the recommendation of Senate President Mike Miller's son, emerged the appointment of three outstanding attorneys whose hard work and legal skills will serve each of them well in the years to come.

We look forward to congratulating our new judges in person as the

Practice Notes...

Criminal defenses - imperfect self-defense & hot-blooded response: Overturning precedents, the Court of Appeals here holds that imperfect self-defense & hot-blooded response now are permitted defenses for first degree assault, in addition to homicide cases. *Christian v. Md.*; *Stevenson v. Md.*, 405 Md. 306 (2008).

Criminal evidence - dog sniffs: The CSA holds "reasonable, articulable suspicion" is not required to obtain a dog sniff in a traffic stop (provided there is no unreasonable delay). *Padilla v. State*, 180 Md. App. 210 (2008).

Civil procedure - res judicata - privity of corporate members: While personal liability per se may require a different standard, the CSA here holds that res judicata applies to bar re-litigation by husband and wife of real estate title issue previously litigated by the corporation which attempted to protect their real estate, where husband was officer of corporation for 35 years and actively participated in prior litigation with same attorney.

Kim v. Council of Owners..., 180 Md. App. 606 (2008).

Contract - indemnity vs. counsel fees: Where contract called for indemnity, but made no explicit reference to counsel fees as part of this, the Court of Appeals construed the indemnity clause to exclude counsel fees under the "American Rule." *Nova Research v. Penske Truck Leasing*, 405 Md. 435 (2008).

A lawyer in a strange land

Perhaps five years ago I was present at a dinner hosted by the Bar Association to welcome Alan Friedman home from a year long stay in the Republic of Georgia where he was working to mentor the development of a fledgling legal system. At the time I felt incredibly jealous that he had the opportunity to explore another part of the world while playing within his chosen profession. Today it is no longer jealousy. First, because today's headlines speak to how difficult the course of democracy has been in other parts of the world and because I find myself in a similar and altogether more backward situation.

My first "profession" was as a Naval Officer. After leaving active duty in 1992 to attend law school I retained my commission because I wanted to retain that identity and in order to keep open lines of communication with that life. On September 11, 2001, when a triple tragedy struck, like many people, I felt awkwardly impotent, desiring to do

something meaningful, but powerless to do much. I recall going to a blood bank that day only to find a line far exceeding the capacity of the bank to accept deposits that day. Instead I went home to my family happy to be safe, depressed at the portents and wondering what I could do.

I continued my law practice as a few friends went "over there". I worried about them and welcomed them home. I felt incredibly saddened at the young lives lost and shattered by the war. And I continued to wonder what more I could do.

Last October I found out what I could do when an eerily anticipated phone call came. A young Navy Petty Officer called me on a Saturday, a very unusual event, and uttered fateful words: "Sir I have to inform you that from this point forward you are under orders to report for mobilization . . ." I confess that my emotions ran from fear to anger to exhilaration to sadness and around again. How would my wife handle this? How could I leave my children? What incredibly important events in their lives would I miss? I then flew to my practice: Who would handle my clients? How would I tell them? What would the firm think?

All of these questions answered themselves in time. A prescient conversation I had with Marty Lessans probably 18 months ago about how to quickly close a practice had prepared me to respond quickly and forthrightly with those questions. To a person -- every client, colleague and opposing counsel responded with regret and genuine concern -- leaving me with a clear conscience.

In November 2007, I traveled to San Diego, CA and then Manhattan, KS to prepare for my deployment to Afghanistan. I have learned many skills that have prepared me for my duties ranging from self-defense to how to be a mentor to an

officer in a foreign military. I also learned about Islamic and Afghan culture and the local language, Dari. These three months did little to assuage the concern about the job ahead. I did make many fast friends and they have been a source of strength and comradeship in a lonely and dangerous business.

In March 2008, I arrived at my temporary home in Gardez, Afghanistan. If you go to Google Maps you will find it easily enough South of the

capital city of Kabul. Gardez is one of the larger

cities in an area of Afghanistan that has seen its share of the millenniums of conflict this region has faced. Up on a hill in the middle of town is a fortress whose foundations were laid by the armies of Alexander the Great. On those foundations and on other hilltops the British have constructed fortresses for their defense in some of their adventures spanning almost a century of history. Nearby are the hulks of old Soviet weapons and minefields left over from their occupation in the 1980s. Also nearby are the battlefields of the US lead intervention in 2001 and 2002. Operation Anaconda, made famous by the story of a Navy Seal who died after a fall from a helicopter, took place not more than 20 miles from where I write this. Pat Tillman, that tragic football player, died in a neighboring province.

Writing these words I wonder how I have found myself in this place. I know the practicalities of how I got here, but what could possibly prepare someone to be here and do these things. Fortunately, I am not called upon to undertake the most difficult tasks of war craft. Instead I am called upon to mentor the leadership of one of the five Army Corps that comprises the Afghan National Army. These leaders are the fighters who drove out the Soviet Union in the late '80s and continued fighting for the control of this long beleaguered country. What could I teach them? After all, I am just a Naval Reservist and an attorney in a land with no oceans and little that counts as a legal system. The closest I had come to warfare was watching

Iran and Iraq duke it out in the late 1980s.

Fortunately, age, some previous experience as a combat leader, negotiation skills, diplomacy and reasoning learned as an attorney have enabled me to wiggle my way into the trust of a very senior officer and provide him a reasoned path ahead for his army and his country. Now we are able to bit by little bit find veins of gold that we can exploit in his force to defeat the enemies of Afghanistan. I do not make this last point lightly. Despite the political wrangling about what we are doing here and how we are doing it, the Afghans, by and large, see the same enemies we do. How to capitalize on that sentiment and the desire for peace and autonomy are the biggest battles we face.

Other than helping the Afghans fight a war, what else do we do? We build roads, wells and schools. We provide seed money for development projects and institution building throughout the country. We help to fight off the cancer of corruption, criminal activity and poverty. These are no small tasks in a land that has rarely known peace throughout its history and has been scourged by modern warfare during the past 30 years. Most of Afghanistan is segmented by ethnic and tribal relationships and by impossibly difficult terrain and it has been pulled asunder by regional conflicts that have evolved over centuries. There is little to unite this country, yet it does not have the centripetal tendencies that we see in Iraq.

Afghanistan is a land of family and local relationships. Tribal, family and ethnic leaders hold much more power than any government official. Laws are customary in the simplest definition of that term. A code of conduct called Pashtunwali provides a central framework for relations among people. Among other things this code requires that anyone seeking shelter under your roof must be granted admittance and safeguarded. This is true even when that person has done great harm to you or your family. This gross simplification of this centuries old custom (pre-dating and often overshadowing the ethical structures imposed by Islam) explains the complexities in trying to convince the Afghan people turn to their government and the United States for assistance and recognize the government as the legitimate power in the land. One day we find ourselves among smiling children in a dusty country village handing out school supplies, blankets and food. The next day we have grown unsurprised when those same people openly provide shelter to the "enemy".

Lawrence of Arabia long ago described the kind of war we are fighting as "eating soup with a knife". It is theoretically possible, but it will certainly take a long time and success will be measured in droplets, not spoonfuls. We fight this war by daily pushing the enemy back economically, politically, philosophically, and yes militarily. The fights in this war will not be World War II era grand tank battles across the plains of Europe and Africa. Nor will they be the stagnant slaughterhouses of the first World War or the Pacific island campaigns. Instead it is a dance, as we move in and out amongst the people and the enemy. We hope that by our show of strength and money and our brilliant ideas, we will slowly develop a wave of good will. That wave is not expected soon.

Am I disheartened by what I see? Not entirely. There are certainly reasons to feel downtrodden by the miniscule advances made after months of hard work followed by the colossal reversals made in a matter of days. But to see the eyes of the children in this land who are living much as their ancestors did centuries ago you know that a good life is something more than the ability to find a Starbucks within walking distance of home. It is amazing how well the micro societies of Afghanistan have functioned without much help from outside. We have a reason to be here and there is much good that can be done here. But there is much that we can and should leave well enough alone so that we leave behind us a society that knows who it is and is not defined solely by its cultural icons.

When I found that I was traveling to Afghanistan, I instantly recalled that iconic National Geographic cover photo of a young Afghan girl with



intensely blue eyes. I think I remember correctly that the photographer was looking for her after the fall of the Taliban at the beginning of this current conflict. I have found her and her siblings hundreds of times in the faces of young Afghan children. In them are hope and tragedy and both in full measure. In this is life and it has provided me a sense of hope about what we do here.

Back to Alan Friedman. I recall the good humor with which he spoke of the problems that faced Georgian constitutionalism and its political future. I too will remember with humor the things that have happened here. Just this week I was laughing and sharing stories with my Afghan friends over a banquet. Tomorrow may bring rockets, an IED or

other tragedies, but that night was a signal that life can be normal around the chaos. Ironically as I am writing this I recall Alan because Georgia is now facing the behemoth at its Northern border.

So I have said little about being a lawyer in Afghanistan. My apologies – there is another tale there perhaps. I would like to publicly thank my family for their support and forbearance in this enforced adventure, for my many friends and colleagues who have sent words of support and a care package or two (I love Twizzlers), for my comrades here for sharing this adventure with me and for the fallen soldiers, marines, sailors and airmen – may they rest in peace and in the arms of God.

Here are a few books that I recommend to learn more about Afghanistan and its people: *The Places in Between*, by Rory Stewart describing his walk from Herat to Kabul in Afghanistan in the months immediately following the fall of the Taliban. Mr. Stewart has gone on to form the Turquoise Mountain Foundation which is finding a unique way of preserving Afghan art and architecture (see <http://www.turquoisemountain.org/>). He is a fascinating young man – I can say young because he is a bit younger than I am and yet he has done so much with his life.

Caravans by James Michener a fictional tale of a girl adrift in Afghanistan with the nomads and the boy who finds her (I use the diminutive for both because they are both so naïve throughout the story). *Not a Good Day to Die* by Sean Naylor (describing Operation Anaconda).

Finally, I recommend *Afghanistan* by Stephen Tanner which provides a broad description of the history of Afghanistan. There are many more books to read and WebPages to view, but there is only so much time.
