David Putzi Installed as 85th President of Anne Arundel Bar Association

ANNAPOLIS, MD. (July 8, 2015) — David P. Putzi, partner at the Glen Burnie-based law firm Fischer & Putzi, P.A., was installed as the 85th president of the Anne Arundel Bar Association (AABA) at the association's annual membership meeting on June 22 at the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County.

The AABA is a nonprofit, professional society of more than 1,100 attorneys practicing in Anne Arundel County and in other communities throughout the Baltimore-Washington metropolitan area. He possesses vast trial experience, appearing every day in the Maryland courts to defend his clients.

Previously, he served as an assistant state's attorney for Anne Arundel County. The cases he was entrusted as a prosecutor included felony, misdemeanor and juvenile offenses. Putzi received his Juris Doctor from The Catholic University of America's Columbus School of Law in 1995.

During the AABA annual meeting, Putzi received the ceremonial president's gavel from outgoing president Steven Oberg and congratulated him on a successful term as president. More than 120 AABA members and guests were present for the installment of Putzi and the new officers and trustees for the 2015-2016 term.
